

Ideally situated in the village, this magnificent I2th-century building has preserved its history and grandeur, with its terracotta floor tiles, stone walls, period staircase and two vaulted cellars.

The building was originally a bakery, whose oven is still inside and heated the whole house. Residents used to collect their bread from the shop via a small courtyard opening onto one of the village lanes. Today, the village is full of artists' studios, antique shops, restaurants and bars, making it a lively district par excellence.
