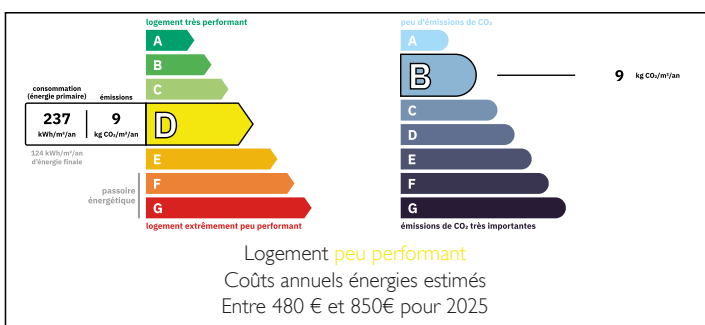
IN BRIEF

Located within the historic ramparts of the charming medieval village of Quarante, this beautifully renovated 95 m² stone house combines authentic character, peace and Mediterranean lifestyle. Tucked away in a quiet pedestrian lane with no cars passing in front of the house, it offers a rare sense of tranquillity just 30 minutes from the Mediterranean beaches.

The house features a bright kitchen and dining area opening directly onto a spacious south-facing 28 m² terrace, three bedrooms, a living room/office, shower room, laundry room and a vaulted cellar. Reversible air conditioning and electric heating provide year-round comfort.
