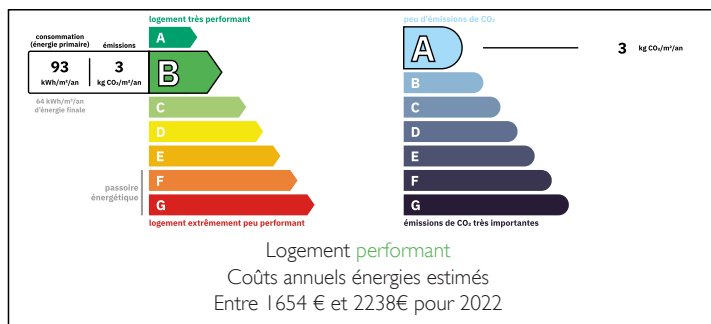
South-facing and filled with natural light, the house offers spacious living areas, an open-plan kitchen and dining room, a utility room and a generous ground-floor master suite. Upstairs are three further bedrooms, a bathroom, separate WC and a large attic offering potential for additional accommodation.

The property is surrounded by approximately 4.5 hectares and includes a flour mill with water rights and bread oven, an oil mill requiring restoration, barns and numerous storage areas.

Two charming terraces beside the mill canal create a wonderful setting for relaxing by the water.

DESCRIPTION

Set in a peaceful and private location just 5 minutes from Barbezieux, this distinctive property offers a rare combination of historic character, generous land and an exceptional collection of traditional outbuildings.

Originally dating from the 17th century, the property has been comprehensively rebuilt, retaining the atmosphere and character of the original site while offering contemporary living comfort and excellent energy efficiency.

South-facing and enjoying plenty of natural light, the house is arranged over two floors.

The main house

On the ground floor, the entrance hall leads to a cosy sitting room with a wood-burning stove and fireplace insert. A spacious second living area opens onto the fully equipped kitchen and dining room, creating a sociable and welcoming space for everyday living and entertaining.

This level also includes a generous utility room and a comfortable master suite with dressing room, bathroom and WC. The ground-floor layout offers the possibility of easy single-level living.

Upstairs, a large landing leads to three further bedrooms, a family shower room and a separate WC. A spacious attic area offers useful storage and potential for additional accommodation, subject to the necessary permissions.

Historic outbuildings and water features

The property benefits from a remarkable collection of traditional buildings, each offering character and potential.

These include:

- A flour mill with water rights, in very good condition;
- An authentic traditional bread oven;
- An adjoining oil mill, requiring restoration;
