Set at the end of a tree-lined driveway in peaceful countryside between Villedieu-les-Poêles and Saint-Sever, and just 35 km from the coast at Granville. A truly rare find on the market.

DESCRIPTION

This unique and characterful property offers an exciting opportunity for renovation and restoration. On the ground floor, you'll find a large dining room (40m²) and/or sitting room featuring a striking granite fireplace, offering a dramatic focal point. A smaller 'temporary' kitchen sits nearby, along with a basic bathroom. There is also access to a lower-level cave, which could be converted into a new kitchen or additional living space, subject to works.

A stone tower staircase leads to the first floor, where there are two very spacious bedrooms and a garderobe-style toilet set within the tower itself. Continuing up the staircase, you'll find two attic rooms under the eaves, with views up into the top of the tower — a unique architectural feature.

All of the doors and windows have been lovingly and skillfully renovated, with great care taken to respect the character and original style of the property; the remainder of the house, however will require a full renovation.

The mature gardens and surrounding grounds are equally charming and add greatly to the property's appeal. A natural spring runs down from the top of the driveway into a private "lavoir," offering a useful water source — ideal for gardeners, nature lovers, or those wishing to create a self sufficient style lifestyle.

The land includes two small paddocks, perfect for keeping horses, donkeys, or other small livestock. On the rear lawn, you'll find an ancient stone bread oven. Adjacent to the house is an ample garage and/or workshop space...
