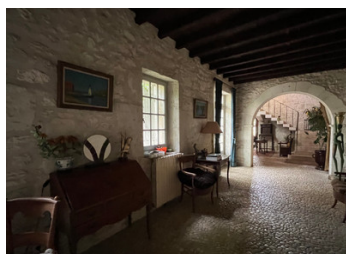

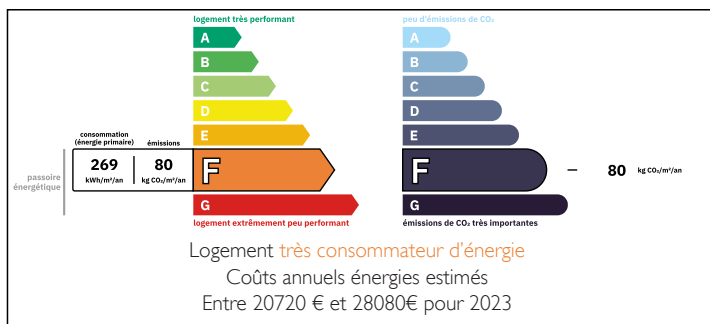

This charterhouse is a large rural property in southwest France, featuring noble architecture that blends seamlessly into its agricultural setting. Nestled in the heart of a hilly landscape, it offers a unique living environment blending history, authenticity, and tranquility.

The first, accessible by a bridge over a moat, offers spectacular access to the property.

The main building, framed by two elegant towers, offers a harmonious façade that is particularly representative of the region's noble architecture.

The main entrance is at the center of this building and connects the main courtyard to the rear park, creating a unique and luminous perspective upon arrival.

At the rear, a vast vaulted hall with exposed stone walls and rammed earth floors offers a warm and authentic atmosphere.

The generously proportioned living rooms feature French ceilings with exposed beams and natural light thanks to the numerous openings.

The reception rooms, meanwhile, are spacious and bright, featuring period features carefully preserved by the current owners:

- Finely crafted woodwork and wall tapestries,
 - Painted overmantels above the doors and fireplaces,
 - Monumental carved fireplaces,
 - Antique herringbone parquet floors and antique terracotta tiles,
 - French ceilings, giving each living room a unique character.
