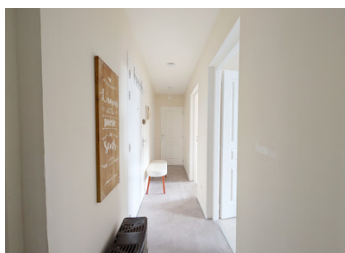

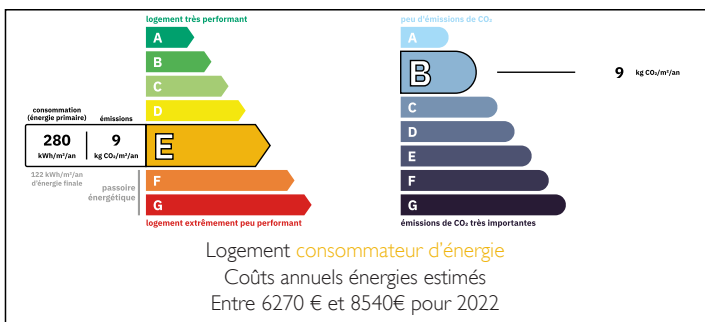
IN BRIEF

DESCRIPTION

GROUND FLOOR: bar with beautiful Art Nouveau ceiling mouldings. Toilets to rear of bar.

Separate entrance to apartments - all apartments are laid out in the same way and are approximately the same size (see description of Apartment 4)

FLOOR 1 - APARTMENT 1

FLOOR 2 - APARTMENT 2

FLOOR 3 - APARTMENT 3 (this apartment has a rear door from the kitchen to the road behind)

FLOOR 4 - APARTMENT 4: hallway, living room/dining room, bedroom 1, bedroom 2 leading to bedroom 3, store cupboard housing washing machine and water heater, bathroom with WC, kitchen.
