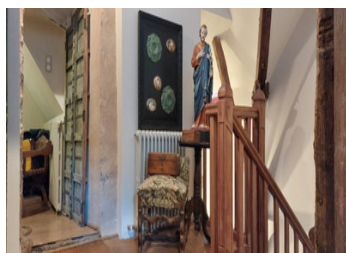
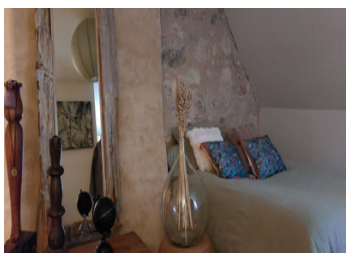

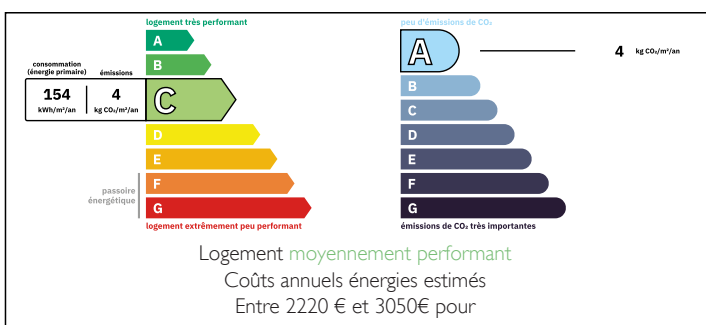
IN BRIEF

Discover this rare property in the heart of Autoire, an iconic village in the Lot region listed among Les Plus Beaux Villages de France (The Most Beautiful Villages of France). The house enjoys unobstructed views of the natural cirque of Autoire, a remarkable site in the Dordogne valley.

Facing north-east/south-west, it combines old architectural features with careful restoration of the Quercy stone façades, carried out in accordance with heritage standards. Built on three levels, the property includes a converted attic and a ground floor for mixed use with a workshop, storage room and commercial space currently used as a tea room and shop. The garden level, dedicated to living space, offers a kitchen with island opening onto a terrace and garden, a 42 m² dining room, a bedroom and shower room. Upstairs, there are two bedrooms, one with an en-suite...

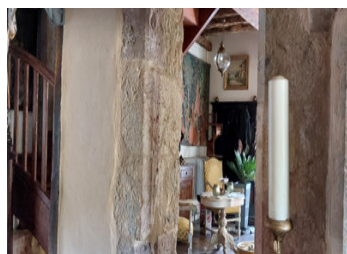

DESCRIPTION

Discover this rare property in the heart of Autoire, one of the most photogenic and sought-after villages in the Lot region, listed among Les Plus Beaux Villages de France (The Most Beautiful Villages of France).

Between Gramat and Saint-Céré lies the village of Autoire, over eight centuries old and a true gem of the Dordogne Valley. At the heart of this historic village, the houses are arranged in a circular pattern around the Romanesque church, forming a kind of protective enclosure. Overlooking the village, the former feudal castle—now converted into the town hall—presides over an unusually high concentration of manor houses, earning Autoire the nickname “Little Versailles.”

The commune is part of two protected natural areas, offering an exceptional setting. Among its highlights is a striking amphitheater of limestone cliffs, from which the Toire stream emerges in a spectacular 30-meter waterfall.

Ideally located, Autoire is just 50 minutes from Brive-la-Gaillarde (with its airport and train station), 10 minutes from Saint-Céré, and less than 9 km from the TER train station in Biars-sur-Cère. The village also provides all essential amenities for everyday life.

Most likely constructed between the 15th and 16th centuries for modest domestic purposes, it tells part of the story of this singular fortified village, distinguished by its graceful simplicity.
