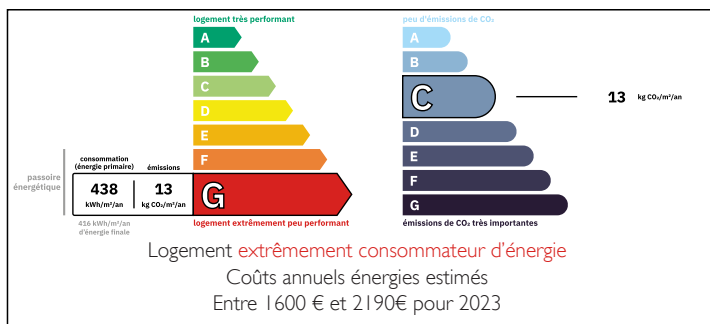

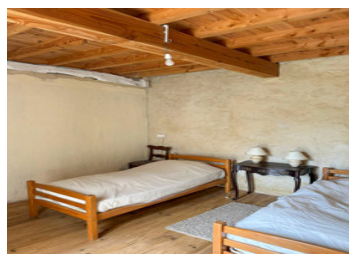
Set in the peaceful Gers countryside, with far-reaching views and the Pyrenees visible on clear days, this is above all a place designed for bringing people together.

DESCRIPTION

Situated in the small historic hamlet of Balarin, close to Montréal-du-Gers, this former stone farmhouse offers an unusual combination of private accommodation, communal areas, guest space and extensive outbuildings.

Rather than following the conventional layout of a holiday home, the property provides a flexible collection of spaces particularly suited to those looking for somewhere to live, receive guests and develop a group or residential project.

MAIN HOUSE:

The main house comprises a kitchen (18 m²), a living room (17 m²) with wood-burning stove and dual-aspect windows, two generous bedrooms (17 m² each) and a shower room (6 m²).

One bedroom has independent access through French doors onto a terrace.

Across the terrace is a separate stone room (12.5 m²) with its own entrance, providing a third bedroom.

INDEPENDENT GUEST ACCOMMODATION:

A separate stone building provides independent guest accommodation.

On the ground floor, an open-plan living and dining space (22 m²) is centred around an original stone fireplace. The chimney is prepared for the installation of a wood-burning stove if desired.

Wooden stairs lead to a sleeping area (18 m²) beneath a beautifully restored roof with exposed timbers.

This arrangement offers the possibility for an owner to live privately while guests, family, participants or a teacher/facilitator can be accommodated
