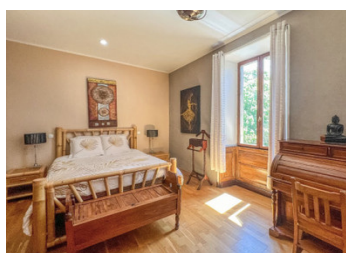
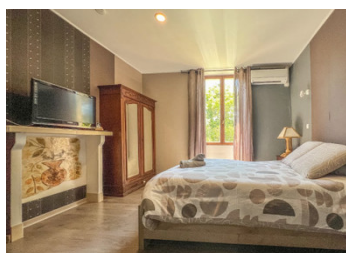

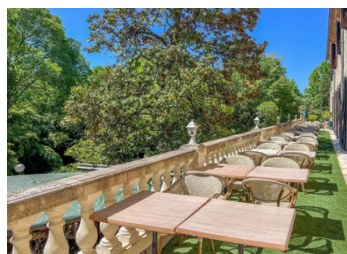

## DESCRIPTION

Richard Singer of Leggett Immobilier International is delighted to present this exceptional property, a magnificent 17th-century former Capuchin convent and chapel, carefully restored and transformed into an impressive hotel and restaurant complex while preserving its remarkable architectural character and historical significance.

Occupying approximately 2,000 m<sup>2</sup> over four levels, this unique property combines exceptional heritage with an outstanding commercial opportunity. The sale concerns the buildings only, with the existing business assets and goodwill to be negotiated separately.

The garden level opens directly onto the beautifully landscaped grounds and offers an impressive 100 m<sup>2</sup> vaulted reception hall, a 54 m<sup>2</sup> dance hall, a 120 m<sup>2</sup> terrace, professional kitchen, workshop, storage areas and a bar/office.

Within the gardens is a second fully equipped restaurant with its own professional kitchen and attractive Balinese and Thai-inspired dining areas, offering seating for approximately 400 guests indoors and 600 guests outdoors, making the property perfectly suited for weddings, conferences, private functions and large-scale events.

The principal entrance opens onto an extraordinary 37-metre vaulted corridor, leading to a second spectacular 100 m<sup>2</sup> reception room, reception office and breakfast area. The original Capuchin kitchen has been beautifully preserved with many authentic period features. A magnificent 600 m<sup>2</sup> terrace extends from this level overlooking the gardens.
