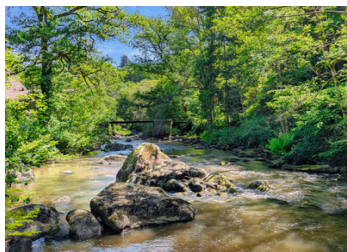

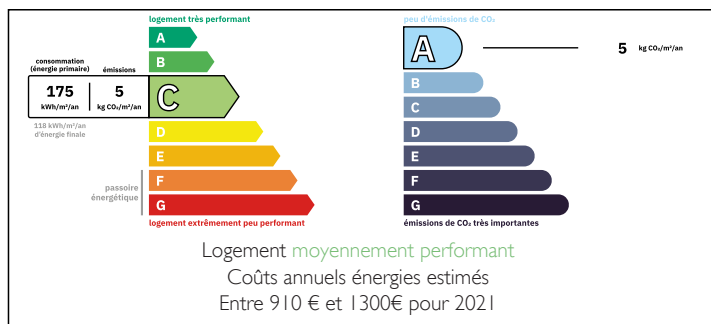

DESCRIPTION

This is your opportunity to purchase a little piece of paradise with a history. Situated right on the river banks of the Sedelle river in Crozant, Limousin is this beautiful 2 bedroom circa 19th century water mill with its own separate guest cottage. This property offers a fusion of charm and old world character with high tech living. Its original purpose was as a cotton mill but now is a popular subject for artists both amateur and professional from all over.

There is a new extended entrance porch which has been designed and built to look as if it has always been there , there is also a ground floor W.C and handbasin in this area.

The ground floor also consists of a large, comfortable open plan kitchen/diner/lounge. The high spec , bespoke fitted kitchen (all Miele appliances) takes up one large area with the dining area opposite. The rest of the room is taken up by the cosy lounge space with its woodburning stove and large, tall window looking out over the river. From here , in one corner, is the bespoke spiral staircase, a feature in itself. It leads to two further floors, one below, which houses a large bedroom with ensuite, a second lounge/T.V room giving autonomy to any guests, the utility room where all of the controls are for the modern equipment. There is also access to a cellar on this level.
