

Exceptional Historic Town Residence of 416m with Walled Garden and Rare B Energy Rating

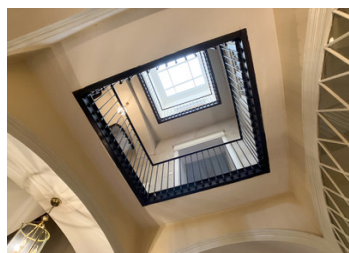

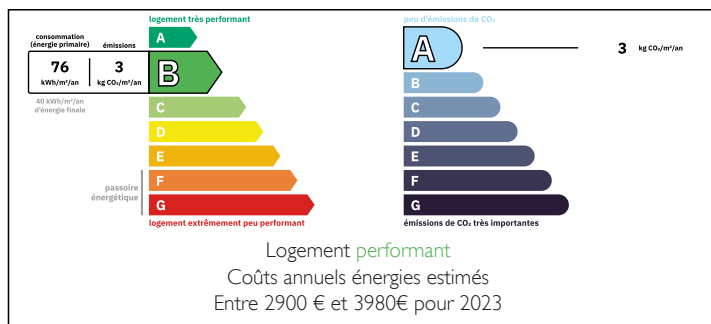

Behind an elegant stone façade in the heart of one of the Gers' most desirable market towns lies a remarkable historic residence offering over 416m² of beautifully proportioned accommodation. Created through the union of two historic town houses, this exceptional home combines period character with contemporary comfort, including a rare B Energy Rating following extensive recent improvements. Organised around a magnificent entrance hall with an impressive double staircase beneath a glazed roof lantern, the property offers elegant reception rooms, five bedrooms, three bathrooms, two former consulting rooms, a large east-facing terrace, a private enclosed garden of 1,466m², and a substantial two-storey outbuilding offering excellent future flexibility, subject to the necessary permissions.

DESCRIPTION

Behind an elegant stone façade, this remarkable historic residence reveals little of the impressive scale and architectural quality awaiting inside. Crossing the threshold, visitors are welcomed by a magnificent central entrance hall featuring an elegant double staircase rising beneath a glazed roof lantern that floods the space with natural light.

Extending to over 416m² of living accommodation, the property was created through the sympathetic joining of two historic town houses, creating an exceptional family home that successfully combines heritage architecture with modern living.

The current owners have recently undertaken significant improvements while carefully preserving the building's historic character. A modern air-to-water heat pump supplying the original radiators, an elegant contemporary kitchen and numerous technical upgrades have resulted in an outstanding B Energy Rating—a remarkable achievement for a residence of this age and scale.

The ground floor provides an elegant succession of reception rooms together with two former consulting rooms, one benefiting from its own WC. This arrangement is equally suited to family life, home working or the continuation of a professional practice.

Throughout the house, generous ceiling heights, original fireplaces, terracotta floors, traditional joinery and many period features reflect its rich architectural heritage.

The impressive family kitchen is centred around a magnificent carved fireplace imported from Germany and opens directly onto the spacious east-facing terrace, creating an ideal setting for entertaining throughout the seasons.

The first floor offers five generous bedrooms, three dressing rooms and three bathrooms. Elegant
